"Know all men by these presents, that we Joseph Schwegler and Anna Schwegler, wife of said Joseph Schwegler of the County of Gasconade in the State of Missouri, have, this day, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand, dollars, to the said Joseph Schwegler in hand paid by Diedrich Weidemann of the County of Gasconade in the State of Missouri, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Diedrich Weidemann the following described tracts or parcels of land, situate in the County of Gasconade, in Missouri; that is to say:

The northwest qr of northeast qr, northeast qr of northwest qr, northwest qr of northwest qr of section sixteen (16) and the southwest qr of southwest qr, southwest gr of southeast qr of section nine (9), township forty three (43), range (6) west, containing two hundred acres more or less. To have and to hold the promises hereby conveyed, with all the rights, privileges and appurtenances belonging, or in anywise appertaining, unto the said Dederick Weideman, his heirs and assigns forever, upon this express condition: Whereas, the said Joseph Schwegler, on the fourth day of October, 1866 made, executed an delivered to the said Dedrich Weidemann certain promissory note, in words and figures follow, to-wit:

Gasconade County, October 4th, 1866

Four years after date I promise to pay to Dedrich Weidemann on order the sum of one thousand dollars for value received, negotiable and payable with refutation or discount and with interest from date at the rate of seven per cent per annum.

Now if said Joseph Schwegler dies executor or administrator, shall pay the sum of money specified in said note, and all the interest that may be due thereon, according to the tenor and effect of said note, then this conveyance shall be void, otherwise it shall remain in full force and virtue in law.

And the said Dedrich Weidemann, or his executor, or administrator may proceed to sell the property herein before described, or any part thereof, at public vendue, to the highest bidder, at the court house, in the County of Gasconade for cash in hand, first giving thirty days public notice of the time, terms and place of sale, and of the property to be sold, by advertisement (in some newspaper printed or circulated in the County where the premises are situate) and upon such sale, and the payment of the purchase money shall execute and deliver a conveyance of the property so sold, to the purchaser thereof; and any statement of fact or recital by the said Dederich Weidemann in such conveyance in relation to the advertisement, sale, receipt of the purchase money, or execution of such conveyance, shall be received as prima facie evidence of the truth thereof. And the said Dederich Weidemann shall, with the proceeds of the sale aforesaid, pay, first, the expenses of this trust, and next, whatever may be in arrears or unpaid on said note, whether of principal or interest, and the balance (if any) shall be paid over to the said Joseph Schwegler or his legal representative.

Anna Schwegler, third wife of Joseph Schwegler, Sr. is appointed Guardian and Curator the Estate of minor, Julius Schwegler by the Probate Court of Gasconade County, Missouri, November 21, 1971.

Anna Schwegler, third wife of Joseph Schwegler, Sr. is cited for failure to "come forward and settle accounts as" Guardian and Curator of the estate of minor, Julius Schwegler on January 13, 1874.

Frederich Leimkuhler, third husband of Anna Fehner Kalteweihr Schwegler, is appointed Guardian and Curator of the Estate of minors, Julius Schwegler, 15 years of age, Francis Schwegler, 12 years of age and Joseph Schwegler, 9 years of age on August 20, 1874.

Gasconade County, Missouri; Circuit Court Book "E", Page 599, November 5, 1881 - Naturalization:

"JULIUS SCHWEGLER a native of Switzerland, who applies to be admitted a citizen of the United States, comes and proves to the satisfaction of the Court, by the testimony of Kasten Buschmann and Louis Hoffmann two credible witnesses, citizens of the United States, that he arrived in the United States a minor, under the age of eighteen years, that he has resided in the United States at least five years, including the years of his minority; and in the State of Missouri at least one year, immediately preceding this application during which time he has conducted himself as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and the said applicant declaring here in open Court, upon oath, that for three years last past it has been bonafide his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and he declaring also upon oath, that he will support the Constitution of the United States and that he doth also absolutely renounce and abjure forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign power, prince, state and sovereignty whatsoever, and particularly to the Republic of Switzerland of whom he is at present a subject, therefore, the said JULIUS SCHWEGLER is admitted a citizen of the United States.

1900 Federal Census of Maries County, Missouri for Julius Schwegler states that his father was born in Germany. This has been proven incorrect.

1900 Federal Census of Maries County, Missouri for Julius Schwegler states that Schweglers immigrated in 1867; the Obituary of Julius Schwegler, written by Harley D. Schwegler states 1863. Mr. Schwegler told my mother many times that he was four years old when brought to this country. (WLS) The actual date that the S.S. Hansa landed in New York City with this family on board was July 20, 1863 and has been documented by the ship's manifest.

1900 Federal Census of Maries County, Missouri for Julius Schwegler states that he was born in Germany; family tradition has always stated Lucerne, Switzerland. His naturalization court record verifies Switzerland.

Sarah Francis Ridenhour Schwegler's application for a pension as a blind person was approved by the Maries County Probate Court on 28 June, 1923. The diagnosis was provided by Dr. Clyde P. Dyer of St. Louis, Missouri as Glaucoma, absolute secondary cataract in both eyes.

Julius Schwegler Obituary copied from the "Home Advisor" published at Vienna, MO. Written by his son Harley Schwegler, exact date unknown but probably published the same week he died.

Aged County Resident Dies

Julius Schwegler Passes Away at Home of his Son of Paydown

Julius Schwegler, born in Lucerne, Switzerland January 31, 1859 and died February 21, 1943 at the home of his son H. D. Schwegler of Paydown at the age of 84 years and 21 days.

He moved with his parents to Illinois in 1863; later he located in Gasconade County in 1876. His father died when he was eleven years of age.

In 1880 he was married to Sarah Francis Ridenhour and to this union were born six children, Oliver M., Harley D., Benjamin F., Harrison Wright, Ida J., and Rainey A. Oliver M. and Ida J. died when small. His companion died 1924.

He leaves twenty-five grandchildren and six great grand-children besides one half brother, Joe Schwegler Sr. and a host of other relatives and friends. For the past several years he has made his home among his children.

He has been a member of Church of Christ for at least 50 years and quite active in church work. He was largely instrumental in building the Bethel meeting house where the congregation of which he was a member at the time of his death now meets for worship.

Funeral services were held Tuesday morning at Bethel, Rev. W. F. Jones of Iberia officiating under direction of Birmingham Funeral Home of Vienna and burial was in the church cemetery there. Five grandsons Leslie Schwegler, Pvt. Dorus Schwegler, Willis Mitchell, Second Class Seaman Frank Schwegler and August Schwegler and a nephew Joseph Schwegler were pallbearers.

rites WEDNESDAY FOR BELLE WOMAN KILLED BY TRAIN

Mrs. Ella Mitchell Bacon, 51, of Belle, was critically injured Saturday morning when she was hit by a train near the main street crossing at Belle.

Witnesses who watched helplessly said Mrs. Bacon was carrying a package, apparently had dropped something blowing away, and was walking bent over to retrieve the lost item, the top part of her body extended over one rail of the track. Mrs. Bacon, who was hard of hearing, wore a hearing aid but the batteries were dead, although she was carrying new ones, a brother said.

Bill Jones and Elmer Cordsmeyer Jr., working nearby, saw the woman walking in the path of the approaching train with its whistle blowing and bell ringing, and tried to warn her. Chester Vernon of Eldon, the Rock Island engineer, said the woman gave no indication she was aware of the approaching train. The woman was struck on the head and thrown from the path of the train at a point about 100 feet west of the crossing.

Identification was made from papers carried in her billfold, due to the profusion of blood. Mrs. Bacon was taken to Phelps County Memorial Hospital at Rolla where she died at 6 p.m.

She was born Dec. 24, 1912 at Belle, a daughter of Joseph and Amanda Scarlett Mitchell. Mrs. Bacon was twice married, both marriages ending by divorce; first to Ben Schwegler, now of Pilot Knob, by whom two daughters were born, and to Alfred S. Bacon, now of Rolla.

Surviving are the daughters, Mrs. Alma Moman of Belle and Mrs. Oletha Keith of Topeka, Kans.; eight grandchildren; the mother, Mrs. Amanda Mitchell of Belle; two brothers, Henry and Willis Mitchell of Belle; and three sisters, Mrs. Clara Jarvis, Belle; Mrs. Minnie Dingley Steelville; Mrs. Amelia Miller, Truth or Consequences, N.M.

Funeral services were from the High Gate Baptist Church Wednesday afternoon with the Rev. Richard H. Terrill officiating.
