## A SOUND CHURCH IS HARD TO FIND

Nay, verily! Here are some things that preclude soundness in many of those congregations:

- Endorsing unsound works and liberal brethren—World Bible School, for instance.
- In any way supporting efforts that are unfaithful.
- Employing "children's church" and/or small group meetings in lieu of Sunday evening services.
- Involvement in "Lads to Leaders" and "Leaderettes."
- Creating "offices" that include women in leadership roles.
- Fellowshipping those who have sinned, but refuse to repent.
- Endorsing those who endorse false teachers.
- Dismissing Sunday night worship for the Super Bowl.
- Providing Scripture-starved sermons.
- Allowing agnostic presentations of the facts of the faith.

The above list is in no way complete, and despite accusations of some, these are not "legalistically" determined issues.
