**HISTORY OF MARIES COUNTY
EVERETT MARSHALL KING
POE REFERENCES**

The **POE** home was just inside of present Maries County, northeast of Summerfield, and Madison **POE** died there about 1847. Of the eleven children born to them, Eliza, John, Zephaniah, Ezra and Sanford must have died in infancy, or at least single, since no record of any descendant of any of them has been found. The six who left descendants were:

Mary Ann **POE**, the oldest child, born January 21, 1831, married a Johnson and has been dead many years. Her three children were: Barney, Jennie, and Lyda. The latter married a man named **LANCE**, and is also dead survived by two children, Andrew and Alta.

NOTE: (*The marriage of Mary Ann **POE** and William **ANDERSON** is recorded in Osage County Marriage Book "B", Page 92 under the date of July 13, 1848. Mr. King's information is incorrect. A daughter of Catherine Sara Poe married Thomas Lore and their children are Andrew and Alta. WLS*)

Mrs. Mary Ann **Anderson** died Tuesday shortly after noon. Her age was about 79 years. Mrs. **Anderson** was the mother of Mat **Anderson**, 3½ miles north of town. The remains were laid to rest yesterday in the Buck Elk cemetery.

From Jane **Wagner Honse**, June 14, 2007: "I went from only knowing that William **Anderson** was born Nov., 1824 in Bond County, Illinois to finding his siblings and his grave. I now have a picture of his headstone. It reads 'WM **Anderson**; Nov. 9, 1824; Sep. 1, 1902. He is buried in Westview aka No. 2 Cemetery in Hollis, Harmon County, Oklahoma. His sister, Elizabeth **Groff** is also in the same cemetery."

From Jane **Wagner Honse**, June 16, 2007: "I was told by a gg granddaughter of Malissa **Groff** that it had been passed down through their line that he used to work with the railroad and that he took the train to visit his sister."

Sanford and Elizabeth **Groff** are household #206 in the West Part of Duke Township, Greer County, Oklahoma in the 1900 Federal Census. Harmon County was created out of Greer County and some land in Texas as a result of litigation that settled the Texas/Oklahoma state line in 1909.
