Minnie Dreyse

Minnie E. **Dreyse** of Belle died suddenly Thursday evening, March 11, 1993, in a St. Louis hospital. She was 96. Minnie was born near Summerfield on February 11, 1897. She is the daughter of the late Ludwig and Mary **Williams Picker**. On September 14, 1919, Minnie was joined in marriage to George **Dreyse** and to this union four children were born.

Surviving Minnie are two daughters, Maymie **Hartig** of House Springs and Bernice **Lambert** with her husband Ralph of Rogers, AR; one son Ernst Gene **Dreyse** with his wife Doris of Monroe, Wash.; 12 grandchildren; 13 great grandchildren; and nine great-great grandchildren.

Minnie is preceded in death by her-husband George; a son George Jr., and all of her brothers and sisters; Julia **Klebba**, Adolph **Picker**, Ben **Picker**, Sophia **Baumgartner** and Mary **Higgins**; and two grandchildren.

Minnie was a lifetime resident of the community, a member of the Railroad Auxiliary, and the First Christian Church in Belle.

Services were held the following Monday in the Christian Church with Don **Wortman** officiating. Interment was in the Liberty Cemetery.

Notes:

George **Dreyse** served in the U.S. Marine Corp from September 15, 1917 until February, 1919 and was honorably discharged at Galveston, Texas. The USMC Muster Rolls show him serving at various locations within the U.S. as well as Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and aboard the USS Hancock.
