Hershel **Wagner** was born two and one-half north of Perry, Pike county, Illinois, March 13th, 1896, and died in Maries County, Missouri, April 20th, 1944; he was a son of Alfred Casper **Wagner** and Norah Elizabeth **Test Wagner**.

He was married to Clara Aleen **Koerber**, daughter of Louis Barney and Para Anna **Koerber**, on February 23rd, 1922, and was the father of eight children. Walter, Clarence and Winston preceded him in death, leaving six sons, Ralph Leroy, Shirley Delmar, Melvin Delano, Clemens Wayne, Stanley Hershel and Lary Alfred **Waffner**.

He also leaves to mourn his death his father and mother, four brothers and four sisters: Charles William and Clarence Emery, of Vienna; Alfred Casper and Leo Marion, of Baylis, Illinois; Odessa Christina **Stratman**, Etta Rosa **Stratman**, Velvia Leona **Crider** and Dollie May **Crum** all of Vienna; in addition he is survived by a number of nieces and nephews.

Hershel was a kind and loving father; he always loved his friends and his greatest desire was to make more.

He was taken sick July 14th, 1943 and from that time on he spent all of his time in hospitals and in the homes of relatives, where they devoted all their time to caring for him. He was treated by a number of physicians, and was a patient in Illonis hospital, at Pittsfield, Illinois and St. Mary's Hospital, Jefferson City, Missouri, but nothing did him any good. He died at the home of his parents.

He was laid to rest in the Methodist Church at Rader. His pallbearers were his six brother-in-laws H.E. Crum, Frank Stratman, Joe Stratman, Curtis Crider, Chris Marhoff, Lewis Koerber.
