Roy's love of farming began at an early age. He started going along with his father to feed the animals when he was only two years old. He loved every aspect of farming. In his early years, he helped his dad do the field work with a team of horses, but with the popularity of tractors, he soon fell in love with the poppin' Johnny. He often worked in the fields from\ sunup to sundown; the poppin' sounds of the 50 John Deere made those long hours more tolerable. He raised steers and hogs through the 4-H program at Safe, MO. During high school, he was active in agriculture started by Ford Hughes and FFA.

After graduating from John F. Hodge High School, he began working with his uncle, in the clay business. During this time, he had his first chance to run a bulldozer in 1955; this was the beginning of his future career in the excavating business. He continued operating the bulldozer for his uncle or Dr. **Stricker** until 1963 he bought his first bulldozer, a D7 Caterpillar from Bill **Cox** and started his own business. His first job was helping to build the pool at the St. James Park. A few years later, he dug the lake in the park. He really enjoyed running the bulldozer, and he had a natural talent for constructing lakes. He continued the excavating with his wife, Bonnie, as his secretary until 2002 when his son, Terry took over the business.

In 1964, he and his wife purchased his Grandpa and Grandma **Dillon**'s farm, and he started raising Hereford cattle. In 1989, he began **Dillon** Fertilizer along with his wife, his sons and their wives; they operated it until 2002. He retired in 2000; although it was a retirement on paper only. He continued to help Terry restoring clay pits and raising cattle. He raised beef cattle that he sold to local customers. He spent many hours reading the farm journals learning how to build his herd to have the correct percentage of fat and marbling to get the best tasting beef. He kept his family appraised of his success in this venture often during our family dinners, especially if steak was for dinner. However, he and my brothers found out the breed mixes that produced great tasting beef sometimes produced cows with undesirable traits which made the cattle working days quite eventful; his sons and grandchildren have many stories to share.

He served his country in the United States Army in Germany in 1957-1959. He was a member of Broadway Baptist Church.
