Born in 1927 in Chickasha, OK to Bill and Ouida **Turner**, Marvin graduated from Chickasha High School and directly following graduation, joined the United States Army. Following his service, which took him to Germany during World War II, Marvin attended the University of Oklahoma in Norman. He graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science. He and Doris, who would later become his wife, met while they were in their teens. Doris, who lived in Florida at the time, was visiting with her grandmother in Chickasha. Their first date involved a horseback ride which was one of Marvin's favorite pastimes of his youth.
