Funeral services for Mrs. Anice **Bauman** were conducted Saturday at the Liberty Church of Christ with Minister Arvil **Elrod** officiating. Burial was in the Liberty Cemetery.

Mrs. Bauman was born in Osage County, May 24, 1881 a daughter of the late William and Mary **Richa Poe** and died suddenly at her apartment in Dixon Thursday, February 14. She was 82 years old.

She and Thomas **Shockley** were married January 20, 1901. Mr. **Shockley** died August 25, 1912. Surviving of the six children born of this marriage are a son Buell **Shockley** of Denver, Colo. and a daughter Mrs. Earl (Sophia) **Thompson** of Union.

August 16, 1923 she was married to Lex **Clark** who died in July, 1934. One daughter, Mrs. Nadine **Schwegler** of Dixon, born of the marriage survives.

On April 6, 1935 she was married to August **Bauman** who preceded her in death in 1940.

Mrs. **Bauman** is also survived by six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

She is the last of her family being preceded in death by four brothers and two sisters.

Mrs. **Bauman** was baptized at the Old Frame Church at an early age and remained a life long member of her church, the Liberty Church of Christ.
